# THE FEAST OF THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS

"Let us not then be ashamed to confess the Crucified. Be the Cross our seal made with boldness by our fingers on our brow, and on everything; over the bread we eat, and the cups we drink; in our comings in, and goings out; before our sleep, when we lie down and when we rise up; when we are in the way, and when we are still. Great is that preservative; it is without price, for the sake of the poor; without toil, for the sick; since also its grace is from God. It is the Sign of the faithful, and the dread of devils: for He triumphed over them in it, having made a show of them openly; for when they see the Cross they are reminded of the Crucified; they are afraid of Him, who bruised the heads of the dragon" (St. Cyril of Jerusalem, Catechetical Lecture XIII, 36).

Commemorated on September 14, the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross celebrates the discovery, recovery, and above all, the saving meaning of Christ's Cross — His sacrifice turned into the ultimate sign of life and glory. It is not just a historical memory, it also has a strong anti-heresy role in Christian tradition. It became a proclamation that the Cross is central to salvation—against distortions that either deny the Cross, reduce its meaning, or replace it with human wisdom or power. Here are the main heresies it directly or implicitly resists:

*Gnosticism:* The Gnostics despised the material world and denied that the Son of God truly suffered in the flesh. For them, the Cross was scandalous—God could not be humiliated. *Feast's Response:* The Exaltation affirms that God truly became man, truly suffered, and truly died on the Cross. The same Cross is exalted because it is the instrument of our redemption.

**Docetism:** Jesus only "appeared" (Greek dokein, to seem) to have a body and suffer; His passion was an illusion. **Feast's Response:** The veneration of the Cross insists that the Passion was real and that salvation came through actual suffering and death, not appearances (Continued on the last page).



(Continuing from the first page) Arianism: Christ was not fully God but a created being; therefore, His death had no infinite saving power. Feast's Response: By exalting the Cross, the Church proclaims that the one who died upon it was the eternal Son of God, and His sacrifice has absolute saving value.

*Manichaeism:* A radical dualism — matter is evil, spirit alone is good. The Cross (a physical death in a body) is meaningless or even evil in this system. *Feast's Response:* The feast proclaims that matter itself is redeemed through the Cross, and the body, far from being evil, becomes the temple of resurrection.

Talmudic-Rabbinic polemic (anti-Cross stance): "Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree" (Deut. 21:23, cited against Christians). Rabbinic Judaism mocked the idea of a crucified Messiah. Feast's Response: The Church glories in the Cross (Gal. 6:14) and reinterprets the curse: Christ became a curse for us so that we might be freed (Gal. 3:13). The very "scandal" of the Cross becomes its glory.

*Islam (emerging later):* The Quran denies that Jesus was crucified ("they did not kill him, nor crucify him, but it appeared so to them" -4:157). *Feast's Response*: The liturgy proclaims year after year: the Cross is not illusion, not substitution, but the real and saving death of Christ.

**Modern Echoes:** *Rationalism / Liberal Christianity:* The Cross is reduced to a moral example of sacrifice, not an objective act of redemption. *Feast's Response:* It insists the Cross is not just symbol but sacramental reality — through it the world is redeemed.

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
